Looking for accommodation with your pet, please look at the following points to manage your expectations and make your search more enjoyable.

- Give yourself more time. There are plenty of pet-friendly landlords, start your search as early as possible.
- Keep your letting agent aware of your requirements. We are happy to help if you can.
- Be more flexible on the location. It's very difficult to find a dog friendly flat in a block of flats.
- Write a real CV for your pet with references Provide information about your pet. Include the contact details of your vet and someone who can care for your pet in an emergency. Include details of your pet's last vaccinations and any flea and worming treatments they have had. By providing a reference from your previous landlord, you can show that your pet is well behaved and has caused no problems at your previous property.
- Introduce your pet to your landlord Meeting your pet mostly likely will put the landlord's mind at ease.
- Written permission It's becoming a standard practice to have pet clause in a tenancy agreement. It can even include the type of a pet and your pet's name.
- Special cleaning: Even if your pet had full flea treatment, you might be asked to arrange for special pest cleaning at the end of your tenancy. If you prefer, this can be arranged by the agent for a fee. This is not end of tenancy cleaning.
- Make moving stress free for your pet When moving into your new home, think about what you can do to make moving day as stress free as possible. Don't leave them without attention in the new place, ask someone to take care of them.
